# **Our Mission**

Working together toward a hunger-free community.

### A Message from Our Executive Director and Board Chair

The past year at **Hamilton Food Share** was truly like no other. As we continued in our mission of working toward a hunger-free community, we found ourselves taking up the charge in responding to the increasing needs of the individuals who access emergency food programs and the unexpected closure of an emergency food bank.

Our role in coordinating and resourcing the emergency food network within Hamilton was highlighted through several initiatives this year. Being uniquely positioned to report on network-wide access to all food banks and hot meal programs operating in Hamilton, **Hamilton Food Share** was able to respond to the unexpected and permanent closure of an emergency food bank. Working alongside the City of Hamilton, our coordinated efforts allowed us to mitigate the impact by resourcing our member agencies to expand staffing, hours of operations and provide additional food supplies to ensure displaced households would continue to receive support. Our established warehouse operations, long-standing relationships with Food Banks Canada and Feed Ontario, and food industry partners enabled us to respond to an urgent need for baby formula and to join forces with the City to establish a menstrual product pilot project.

The addition of a third refrigerated truck to our fleet, and an expansion to our warehouse team was instrumental in achieving another record-breaking year that saw us raise over 3.7 million pounds of food, 74% of which was high-priority fresh and frozen items. Over 2.3 million pounds of nutritious produce, dairy and proteins were distributed to emergency food programs across the city, a 20% increase from last year.

In a year that saw so many unprecedented developments, including a 9% increase in the number of visits made to emergency food programs, what remained the same is the remarkable generosity of each person in this city who found a way to support **Hamilton Food Share**. Every donation to **Hamilton Food Share** translates into food on a neighbour's table. Our ability to meet the increased need was only possible because of how dedicated this community is to helping their fellow Hamiltonians, and the efforts of our **Food Share Team** and our Board of Directors.










# **Celebrating Mike**
